

Presentation Requirements

1. The presentation will be to an invited audience, which will be a minimum of two (supervisor & co-ordinator); probably a panel made up of teachers, governors and/or parents.
2. It will be on a date in February provided by the co-ordinator
3. It must have some focus on the outcomes from the 'End of Project Review'
4. The presentation must assume no prior knowledge on the audience's part.
5. After the presentation there will be questioning from the panel, designed to recognise and explore your research, and the journey you have been on; as well as the authenticity of the work you have submitted.
6. The presentation can focus on the content of the research project, or the process, or both.
7. Presentations may take the form of: talk, PowerPoint, play, exhibition, experiment, guided walk, performance, posters, or your own agreed method (agreed with supervisor and co-ordinator).
8. Please view questions as an 'opportunity' and consider, in advance, the types of questions probable, and suitable responses you may make.
9. Presentations are to be of a maximum length of 15 minutes; total length including questions will not exceed 30 minutes.
10. Remember no one will try to catch you out. The process is intended to allow you to share the journey you have been on!
